



Child Protection

Introduction

- show you how to take action if you know or suspect that a child or young person needs help.

- working in a child-centred way.

Please note

The terminology, legislation, guidance and practice relating to child protection vary between the different nations of the UK. However, the principles are broadly the same. Please see the ‘Resources’ tab for nation-specific information.

The course refers to ‘children and young people’ which includes babies, toddlers, infants, children and teenagers from birth right up to the age of 18.




