Help us in our lives, each day, to know the power of your resurrection.



# I am the Resurrection and the Life

John 11:25

#### Introduction

In the Gospel of John we read the account of Jesus raising his friend Lazarus from the dead. Before going to the tomb Jesus reveals himself to Martha, one of the grieving sisters of Lazarus, as 'the Resurrection and the Life.'

This victory of life over death reaches its climax on the third day after Jesus' own death on the cross when he is raised to new life. At the Easter Vigil we celebrate in a special way his resurrection from the dead, for it is the crowning truth of our faith. (CCC 638)

# **Reflecting on Our Experience**


