# LITURGICAL ORDO THE CYCLE OF PRAYER

The liturgical year has been divided into six periods. We are asked to use the intentions named during the current period, both corporately and in personal prayer, as well as on specific Days of Prayer. Parish Priests are asked to make the Cycle known by displaying and distributing copies in their churches, and to remind people when a new period of the Cycle begins.

When a Day of Special Prayer occurs on a Sunday, it is sufficient to announce the Day at the beginning of Mass and to include a suitable petition in the Universal Prayer.

#### **LOCAL SOLEMNITIES**

Each church celebrates as a Solemnity its Feast of Title, and, if consecrated, the Anniversary of Dedication. If either of these local solemnities falls on a Sunday in Ordinary Time or the Sunday in the Octave of Christmas, then the liturgy of that solemnity replaces that of the Sunday. If they fall on a Sunday of Advent, Lent or Easter, or another Solemnity then they are transferred to the following day. These celebrations may also, for pastoral reasons, be transferred to a Sunday in Ordinary Time or another suitable date.

By tradition, churches where the date of consecration is unknown may celebrate that solemnity on the Sunday before the Solemnity of All Saints or on 25 October.

Churches dedicated to Our Blessed Lord under titles which have no feast day in the calendar keep that solemnity on 6 August, the Transfiguration.

Churches dedicated to Our Blessed Lady under titles which have no feast day in the calendar keep that solemnity on the solemnity of the Assumption.

#### CHOICE OF MASS TO BE CELEBRATED

#### Mass ad libitum in Ordinary Time

Where a Mass is to be celebrated *ad libitum*, the priest may choose: from the Mass formula of the preceding Sunday or any one of the Sundays in Ordinary Time, even with some of the prayers taken from any another Sunday in Ordinary Time or from the prayers for Various Needs and Occasions; or from the Mass of a Saint noted in the calendar as an optional memorial, or of a saint noted in the Martyrology for that day; or from any Mass for the dead, although the formulas of the daily Mass for the dead may only be used if the Mass is actually said for the dead; or a Mass for Various Needs;

or a Votive Mass.

The table of rubrics inserted here governs when celebrations using the formularies from Ritual Masses, Masses for Various Needs and Occasions, Votive Masses, and Masses for the Dead are permitted within the liturgical year.

- V1 Ritual Masses (General Instruction of the Roman Missal [hereafter, GIRM], no. 372). Masses for various needs and occasions and votive Masses, in cases of serious need or pastoral advantage, at the direction of the local Ordinary or with his permission (GIRM, no. 374).
- V2 Masses for various needs and occasions and votive Masses, in cases of serious need or pastoral advantage, at the discretion of the parish priest or the priest celebrant (GIRM, no. 376).
- V3 Masses for various needs and occasions and votive Masses chosen by the priest celebrant in favour of the devotion of the people (GIRM, nn. 373, 375).
- D1 Funeral Mass (GIRM, no. 380).
- D2 Mass on the occasion of news of a death, final burial, or the first anniversary (GIRM, no. 381).
- D3 Daily Mass for the dead (GIRM, no. 381). When D1 and D2 are not permitted, neither is D3.

#### **CHOICE OF EUCHARISTIC PRAYER**

**Eucharistic Prayer I** (the Roman Canon) may always be used, and particularly on days for which proper texts or insertions are provided, the feasts of apostles and saints mentioned in the Prayer, and on Sundays.

*Eucharistic Prayer II* is more appropriately used on weekdays and in special circumstances. It has its own Preface but this may be replaced by another. It is also suitable for a Mass for the Dead as it has a proper insertion.

**Eucharistic Prayer III** is preferred for Sundays and feasts of saints who may be named within it. It is also suitable for a Mass for the Dead as it has a proper insertion.

**Eucharistic Prayer IV** is an integral text with an invariable Preface. It may be used on Sundays and ferial days of Ordinary Time, when a Mass has no Proper Preface of its own.

**Eucharistic Prayers I and II for Reconciliation** have their own Prefaces but may be used with other appropriate Prefaces that refer to penance, for example, the Prefaces of Lent.

Eucharistic Prayers I-IV for use in Masses for Various Needs and Occasions may be used in association with the Votive and other Masses noted in the rubrics for each Prayer. The Prefaces form an integral part of each Prayer and therefore may not be replaced.

#### **FULFILMENT OF OBLIGATION**

The obligation of participating in the Mass is satisfied by assisting at Mass wherever it is celebrated in a Catholic rite, either on the Sunday or Holy Day itself or on the evening of the previous day (Canon 1248:1).

#### **EUCHARISTIC FAST**

Whoever is to receive the blessed Eucharist is to abstain for at least one hour before Holy Communion from all food and drink, with the sole exception of water and medicine (Canon 919:1). A priest who, on the same day, celebrates Mass twice or three times may consume something before the second or third celebration, even though there is not an hour's interval (Canon 919:2). The elderly, and those who are suffering from some illness, as well as those who care for them, may receive the blessed Eucharist even if within the preceding hour they have consumed something (Canon 919:3).

#### RECEPTION OF THE EUCHARIST A SECOND TIME ON THE SAME DAY

It is permitted to receive Holy Communion twice in one day, provided this takes place during the celebration of Mass (Canon 917). This provision is to be observed except in the case of Viaticum for the dying.

#### **FAST AND ABSTINENCE**

Traditional devotions such as making the sign of the cross with care and reverence, praying the Angelus and saying a prayer before or after meals, are straightforward actions which both dedicate certain moments in our daily lives to God and demonstrate our love and trust in his goodness and providence. If these devotions have been lost or even forgotten, particularly in our homes and schools, we have much to gain from learning them again.

Every Friday is set aside as a special day of penitence, as it is the day of the suffering and death of the Lord. It is important that all the faithful again be united in a common, identifiable act of Friday penance since the virtue of penitence is best acquired as part of a common resolve and witness. The law of the Church requires Catholics on Fridays to abstain from meat, or some other form of food or to observe some other form of penance laid down by the Bishops' Conference. The Bishops have decided that this penance be fulfilled simply by abstaining from meat and by uniting this to prayer. Those who cannot or choose not to eat meat as part of their normal diet should abstain from some other food of which they regularly partake. This decision came into effect on Friday, 16 September 2011.

Re-emphasising the importance of penitence is but one of the responses the Bishops wish to make to the growing desire of people to deepen and give identity to the spiritual aspects of their lives. It is also clear than many of us forget our obligation to do penance on a Friday. On a Sunday our prayer is in thanksgiving to God for the new and eternal life brought to us by Christ's resurrection from the dead. On a Friday our prayer is in thanksgiving for the gift of mortal life that we have been given, a life which Christ willingly sacrificed on the cross for our sake. A fitting prayer then, as part of our Friday penance, would be to ask Almighty God to turn away all threats to mortal life. The act of abstinence itself can be offered consciously as a prayer for life and in reparation for sins against life. It can also be put at the service of others if we make a sacrifice and give financial savings made from our abstention (or fasting) to charities which assist those who are poor or suffering. If we are unable to make that financial sacrifice, we can still perform a 'work of charity', an act of kindness and love to another person who is in need or suffering in some way.

Canon 1251 states: 'Abstinence from eating meat or another food according to the prescriptions of the Conference of Bishops is to be observed on Fridays throughout the year unless they are solemnities; abstinence and fasting is to be observed on Ash Wednesday and on the Friday of the Passion and Death of Our Lord Jesus Christ.'

Canon 1252 states: 'The law of abstinence binds those who have completed their fourteenth year. The law of fasting binds those who have attained their majority, until the beginning of their sixtieth year. Pastors of souls and parents are to ensure that even those who by reason of their age are not bound by the law of fasting and abstinence, are taught the true meaning of penance.

Those under 14 years of age, the sick, the elderly and frail, pregnant women, seafarers, manual workers according to need, guests at a meal who cannot

excuse themselves without giving great offence to their hosts or causing friction, and those in other situations or moral or physical impossibility are not required to observe abstention from meat; in other words, we should act prudently.

The Holy See has noted that the 'gravity' of the obligation applies to our intention to observe penance as a regular and necessary part of our spiritual lives as a whole. Therefore, the 'gravity' of the obligation does not relate to observing the specific act of penance (abstaining from meat) prescribed by the Conference of Bishops. The 'gravity' of the obligation applies to the intention to do penance during the prescribed penitential days and seasons of the Church's year. Failure to abstain from meat on a particular Friday then would not constitute a sin.

## **LITURGICAL CALENDAR 2024-2025**

## **Lectionary for Sundays: Year C**

The new edition of the 'Lectionary for Mass' ('Ordo Lectionum Missae') confirmed by the Apostolic See in 2023 comes into use in England and Wales on the First Sunday of Advent 2024. By decree of the Bishops' Conference, 'from that date forward, no other English language edition of the 'Lectionary for Mass' may be used in the dioceses of England and Wales."

#### THE SEASON OF ADVENT

Advent has a twofold character: it is a time of preparation for the Solemnities of Christmas, in which the First Coming of the Son of God to humanity is remembered, and likewise a time when, by remembrance of this, minds and hearts are led to look forward to Christ's Second Coming at the end of time. For these two reasons, Advent is a time of devout and expectant delight (LY39). The playing of the organ and other musical instruments, and the decoration of the altar with flowers should be marked by a moderation suited to the character of this time of year, without expressing in anticipation the full joy of the Nativity of the Lord (GIRM 305, 313; CB 236). The same moderation should be observed in the celebration of Matrimony (OM 32).

### Advent from the beginning until 16 December

On weekdays of Advent on which an Optional Memorial is observed, it is possible to choose either the Office and Mass of the weekday or the Office and Mass of the Saint who is inscribed for that day in the calendar or the Martyrology (IH 244, IM 316b). Only when some genuine need or pastoral advantage requires it may an appropriate Mass for Various Needs and Occasions or a Votive Mass be celebrated (GIRM 333). Daily Masses for the Dead are not allowed (GIRM 337).

In the weekday Office, the invitatory antiphon, the hymns for the Office of Readings, for Lauds and for Vespers, and the antiphon for the Middle Hour are taken from those prescribed for Advent.

Preface of Advent I is used daily until 16 December. Eucharistic Prayer IV is not used in this season.

#### **Advent from 17-24 December**

At Mass proper texts and readings are given for the weekdays from 17-24 December, and these should be used instead of those indicated for the weekdays of the third and fourth weeks of Advent. The weekdays of 17-24 December take precedence over the Memorials of Saints, which therefore may be celebrated only as Optional Commemorations. This means that the Collect of the Saint may be used in place of the Collect of the day. In the Office of

Readings the proper hagiographical reading and responsory may be added after the Patristic reading and responsory; the Collect of the Saint concludes the office. At Lauds and Vespers the antiphon (proper or common) and the Collect of the Saint may be added after the Collect of the day. Only when some genuine need or pastoral advantage requires it may an appropriate Mass for Various Needs and Occasions be celebrated (GIRM 374). Votive Masses and daily Massses for the Dead are prohibited (GIRM 381). In the Liturgy of the Hours the invitatory antiphon, the hymns for the Office of Readings, for Lauds and for Vespers, are taken from those prescribed for the season. Proper antiphons are assigned for the weekday psalms of Lauds and Vespers.

Besides the times of the year that have their own distinctive character, there remain in the yearly cycle thirty-three or thirty-four weeks in which no particular aspect of the mystery of Christ is celebrated, but rather the mystery of Christ itself is honoured in its fullness, especially on Sundays. The period is known as Ordinary Time (LY 43).

When the liturgical day is indicated as a Feria and the Mass is ad libitum, the Priest may choose: from the Mass formula of the preceding Sunday in Ordinary Time or any one of the Sundays in Ordinary Time, even with some of the prayers taken from any other Sunday in Ordinary Time or from the prayers for Various Needs and Occasions; or from the Mass of a Saint noted in the Liturgical Calendar as an Optional Memorial or listed in the Roman Martyrology for that day; or from any Mass for the Dead although the formulas for the daily Mass for the Dead may only be used if the Mass is actualy said for the Dead; or a Mass for Various Needs and Occasions; or a Votive Mass (GIRM 355b).

On Saturdays in Ordinary Time when no Obligatory Memorial occurs, an Optional Memorial of the Blesssed Virgin Mary may be celebrated (*LY 15*). For the Liturgy of the Hours, in the absence of obligatory or optional celebrations, either the Office of a Saint commemorated in the Martyrology for that day may be celebrated, or a votive Office, if there are grounds for doing so.

#### SEASON OF LENT

Lent is ordered to preparing for the celebration of Easter, since the Lenten liturgy prepares for the celebration of the Paschal Mystery both catechumens, by the various stages of christian initiation, and the faithful, who recall their own Baptism and do penance (LY 27).

Memorials which occur on a weekday in Lent may only be commemorated at Mass by using the Collect of the Saint in place of the Collect of the day. In the Office of Readings, the proper hagiographical reading and responsory may be added after the Patristic reading and responsory; the Collect of the Saint concludes the office. At Lauds and Vespers the antiphon (proper or common) and the Collect of the Saint may be added.

On Sundays the Te Deum is omitted in the Office of Readings and the Gloria is omitted at Mass. But the Te Deum and the Gloria are said or sung on Solemnities, Feasts and in particular celebrations.

In the weekday office, the invitatory antiphon, the hymns for the Office of Readings and for Lauds and for Vespers, and the antiphon at the Middle Hour are taken from those prescribed for the liturgical time.

The word Alleluia is always omitted, both in the Liturgy of the Hours and at Mass and in all forms of music until its solemn proclamation before the Gospel at the Easter Vigil.

It is not permitted to decorate the altar with flowers, and the use of the organ and other musical instruments is allowed only to support the singing. Laetare Sunday (the fourth Sunday of Lent), Solemnities and Feasts are exceptions to this rule (GIRM 305, 313).

Especially during the seasons of Lent and Easter the Apostles' Creed may be used as an alternative to the Nicene Creed when the Creed is appointed to be said. Eucharistic Prayer IV is not used in this season. However the two Eucharistic Prayers for Reconciliation may be used with their own Prefaces or with a Preface of Lent.

On Ash Wednesday and the Sundays of Lent, the Prayer over the People is used, with the invitation and prescribed blessing formula given in the *Roman Missal*, p722. On the other days of Lent the use of the Prayer over the People is optional. On ferial days of the Lenten season one of the four Lenten Prefaces is used, unless other provison is made.

For the celebration of marriage the Parish Priest should alert spouses to the need to take account of the particular penitential character of the season (*OM 32*). Masses for Various Needs and Votive Masses are not permitted unless by order or permission of the local Ordinary (*GIRM 374*). Daily Masses for the Dead are not allowed (*GIRM 381*).

#### THE PASCHAL TRIDUUM

Since Christ accomplished his work of human redemption and of the perfect glorification of God, principally through his Paschal Mystery, in which by dying he has destroyed our death, and by rising restored our life, the sacred Paschal Triduum of the Passion and Resurrection of the Lord shines forth as the high point of the entire liturgical year. Therefore the pre-eminence that Sunday has in the week, the Solemnity of Easter has in the liturgical year. The Paschal Triduum of the Passion and Resurrection of the Lord begin with the evening Mass of the Lord's Supper, has its centre in the Easter Vigil, and closes with Vespers (Evening Prayer) of the Sunday of the Resurrection (LY 18-19). The Paschal Fast should also be kept sacred. It is to be celebrated everywhere on the Friday of the Lord's Passion and, where appropriate, prolonged also through Holy Saturday as a way of coming, with spirit uplifted, to the joys of the Lord's Resurrection.

It is highly appropriate that the Office of Readings and Morning Prayer is celebrated solemnly with the people. Vespers of Holy Saturday.

Compline II of Sunday is only said by those not attending the Easter Vigil; in place of the short responsory the antiphon 'Christ humbled himself ...' is said.

The Church abstains from the celebration of Mass. Holy Communion may only be given as Viaticum. Only the Sacraments of Penance and Anointing of the Sick may be celebrated.

#### **EASTER TIME**

The fifty days from the Sunday of the Resurrection to Pentecost Sunday are celebrated in joy and exaltation as one feast day, indeed as one 'great Sunday' (LY 22). Throughout the Easter Season the Angelus is replaced by Regina Caeli. The Apostles' Creed may appropriately be used as an alternative to the Nicene Creed on days when the Creed is appointed to be said. During the Easter Octave Masses for Various Needs and Votive Masses are not permitted. On weekdays after the Octave they are allowed for a real pastoral need or advantage. Daily Masses for the Dead are not permitted.

The entire celebration of the Easter Vigil must take place during the night, so that it begins after nightfall and ends before daybreak.

#### **EASTER TIME**

Throughout Easter Time partcular attention should be paid to the mystagogical formation of the newly baptised (RCIA 235-239).

On weekdays of Easter Time on which no obligatory Memorial falls, it is possible to choose either the Office and Mass and Office of the weekday, or the Office and Mass of an Optional Memorial or of another Saint who is inscribed for that day in the calendar or in the Martyrology (GILH 244, GIRM 355b). Only when some genuine need or pastoral advantage requires it, may an appropriate Mass for Various Needs and Votive Masses be celebrated (GIRM 376). Daily Masses for the Dead are prohibited (GIRM 381).

In the weekday Office, the invitatory antiphon, the hymns for the Office of Readings, for Lauds and for Vespers, and the antiphon for the Middle Hour are taken from those prescribed for the season.

To the antiphons is added Alleluia, unless it is already present, or unless it does not well accord with the sense of the words. Any one of the five Easter Prefaces is said unless other provison is made. Eucharistic Prayer IV is not used in this season.

the Dead; or a Mass for Various Needs and Occasions; or a Votive Mass (*GIRM* 355b).

On Saturdays in Ordinary Time when no Obligatory Memorial occurs, an Optional Memorial of the Blesssed Virgin Mary may be celebrated (LY 15). For the Liturgy of the Hours, in the absence of obligatory or optional celebrations, either the Office of a Saint commemorated in the Marryrology for that day may be celebrated, or a votive Office, if there are grounds for doing so.

#### LECTIONARY FOR SUNDAYS: YEAR A

#### THE SEASON OF ADVENT

Advent has a twofold character: it is a time of preparation for the Solemnities of Christmas, in which the First Coming of the Son of God to humanity is remembered, and likewise a time when, by remembrance of this, minds and hearts are led to look forward to Christ's Second Coming at the end of time. For these two reasons, Advent is a time of devout and expectant delight (LY39). The playing of the organ and other musical instruments, and the decoration of the altar with flowers should be marked by a moderation suited to the character of this time of year, without expressing in anticipation the full joy of the Nativity of the Lord (GIRM 305, 313; CB 236). The same moderation should be observed in the celebration of Matrimony (OM 32).

## Advent from the beginning until 16 December

On weekdays of Advent on which an Optional Memorial is observed, it is possible to choose either the Office and Mass of the weekday or the Office and Mass of the Saint who is inscribed for that day in the calendar or the Martyrology (IH 244, IM 316b). Only when some genuine need or pastoral advantage requires it may an appropriate Mass for Various Needs and Occasions or a Votive Mass be celebrated (GIRM 333). Daily Masses for the Dead are not allowed (GIRM 337). In the weekday Office, the invitatory antiphon, the hymns for the Office of Readings, for Lauds and for Vespers, and the antiphon for the Middle Hour are taken from those prescribed for Advent. Preface of Advent I is used daily until 16 December unless another Preface is specified.

Eucharistic Prayer IV is not used in this season.

# **Advent from 17-24 December**

At Mass proper texts and readings are given for the weekdays from 17-24 December, and these should be used instead of those indicated for the weekdays of the third and fourth weeks of Advent. The weekdays of 17-24 December take precedence over the Memorials of Saints, which therefore may be celebrated only as Optional Commemorations. This means that the Collect of the Saint may be used in place of the Collect of the day. In the Office of Readings the proper hagiographical reading and responsory may be added after the Patristic reading abd responsory; the Collect of the Saint concludes the office. At Lauds and Vespers the antiphon (proper or common) and the Collect of the Saint may be added after the Collect of the day. Only when some genuine need or pastoral advantage requires it may an approprate Mass for Various Needs and Occasions be celebrated (IM 374).

After the annual celebration of the Paschal Mystery, the Church has no more ancient custom than celebrating the memorial of the Nativity of the Lord, and his first manifestations, and this takes place in Christmas Time (LY 32). Eucharistic Prayer 4 is not used in this season.
