I came about 8 months ago. I was homeless and had been living in a tent for 4 months with my boyfriend.

How did you find out about Emmaus?

Becky's Story

A friend at Emmaus Hastings told us about Communities in Greenwich, Dover and St Albans. Only St Albans could offer help to a couple.

What was it like at first?

I was given work in the shop, on the till and answering the phone. My boyfriend worked in the kitchen cooking for the Community.

I had worked in a shop for 4 years as an assistant manager. I was sacked because I needed medical attention and a operation. Then mum kicked me out because her partner returned. I became homeless.

And now, what are you doing now?

I am a Trainee Retail Assistant. It's a two year course at Emmaus St Albans. I help across all 5 shops; stepping in to help with admin, accounts, holiday cover, shop procedures, team management and buying doughnuts.

What would you want others to know about Emmaus?

Do not be scared, there are places out there to help you. I've been helped by regaining my confidence, learning new skills, by having people see the potential in me. I wasr 't just homeless. I needed a chance to learn to rely on the knowledge I had before. **Thank you, Becky.**
