

Outline for the preparation of a Funeral Booklet

The following structure is the basic structure for the Funeral Mass.

You may wish to supplement the basic structure with the words of the hymns and religious songs which will be used at the Mass.

Should you wish to include the words of the readings then they may be included in their 'given' place, or be placed together at the end of the booklet – so as not to discourage the congregation listening directly to the word of God as it is proclaimed to them.

The priest greets the congregation in these words or similar:

Priest: The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ and the love of God
and the communion of the Holy Spirit be with you all.
Congregation: **And with your spirit.**

Congregation: **Glorify to you, O Lord.**

Congregation: **Praise to you, Lord Jesus Christ.**

Memorial Acclamation

Priest: The mystery of faith.

Congregation: **We proclaim your Death, O Lord,
and profess your Resurrection
until you come again.**

or **When we eat this Bread and drink this Cup,
we proclaim your Death, O Lord,
until you come again.**

or **Save us, Saviour of the world,
for by your Cross and Resurrection
you have set us free.**

***NB Only one of the above will be used, and so only that one
should be put in the service booklet***
